Looking Outwards- by Charles Horsefield

When we held a Saturday-morning workshop a few months ago to consider where we wanted to go as a church, a number of initiatives were proposed. Then at the February Church Council meeting the Leadership Team invited people to volunteer to work on these initiatives and Richard Bates and I volunteered to consider and report back on "Public Issues".

We met twice and developed a brief Project Plan which was presented to the June Church Council. This sets out a number of activities and events and these all necessitate the involvement of others at Trinity. Which is the point really. Churches that only look inwards miss opportunities to engage with the rest of the world, develop influence and grow. Evangelism is not a word I use very often but those who do, must surely acknowledge that in order to evangelise, it is necessary to look outwards? And the social gospel that inspires us in varying degrees demands engagement with what we now tend to describe as Public Issues.

Our Project Plan begins with "Raising Awareness" and refers both to this article and to the newsletter of the national Joint Public Issues Team of four churches, including our own. The latest issue is always available on the Trinity web site and if anyone is looking for an opportunity to learn-about, lobby or protest-about issues, that is a good place to look.

Homelessness is a public issue Trinity began to engage with 6 years ago and Patience wrote in Trumpeter last month about the need for more volunteers to help at our weekly Drop-In. But when I first approached Leighton Linslade Homeless Service in 2013, following a discussion at Trinity's Annual Church Meeting, it was with a view to setting up a food bank. At that time they wanted a Drop-In instead but now their activities have grown vastly and they need volunteers for all sorts of things, including running satellite food banks, - just holding a few food bags in churches for collection. Only one volunteer has come forward to help with this at Trinity so we can't run a rota on Sunday mornings at present

but there may be another way forward - watch this space.

Something that is going ahead is an Oxjam concert at Trinity on 5 October, which is our Harvest Festival Weekend. We hope to raise money for and awareness of Oxfam with the help of a lot of local talent, along with a celebrated, large choir from Milton Keynes who sing a range of popular songs. Offers of help with refreshments for this event will be gratefully accepted by Richard and myself! As will any help or thoughts around the idea of an additional, regular, board games session for families from inside and outside Trinity, on Saturdays. Building on occasional week-end events in the recent past, as well as the current Thursday afternoon initiative, the aim will be to build on links and develop friendships. By looking outwards.

Accents by Kathy Keeley

I have always been fascinated by different regional accents. They show people's influences and can help to give a sense of people, place and time. Different places use different words for different things in a similar way to international languages. For those learning a new language this can be confusing and hard to understand. In the hymn, "Oh Jesus I have promised" there is the line, "O let me hear thee speaking in accents clear and still." For people who travel a lot or are in varied company it may be a while before they settle to an accent that belongs to them. Some accents show a mixture of influences like Dick Van Dyke in Mary Poppins.

The word accent can also mean emphasis. How we speak depends on our ability, opportunity and circumstances which influences what we prioritise and feel comfortable with. This is also true of our actions. In 1 John 3:18 the Bible says, "My children, our love should not be just words and talk. It must be true love, which show shows itself in action."

This said we should remember that Jesus was born a child king and it would be time before his love and understanding could come to fruition. This is also true of ourselves and this is why God and the angels are with us in mind, body and/or spirit.

In Psalms 57:1 the Bible says, "... I come to you for safety. In the shadow of your wings I find protection until the raging storms are over." This makes us think of how a bird protects her young, but also a part of a building: remember Jesus was born in a stable.

I see no flag there I see no colours I see no throne of power I see a place like no other.


I see no false idol I see no earthly rule And no earthly representative Nothing else to take that place.

Buzzer Buses—Retiring Collection on 11th August

Buzzer Buses (affectionately known as "The Buzzer") was founded in 1991 and is a well-loved part of the local community enjoying an excellent reputation for caring customer service. The service originated as the Leighton Linslade and District Community Transport Association which ran a single vehicle borrowed from the MS Society and driven by volunteers. This was the first disabled transport service in the town.

Currently Buzzer Buses operate 7 minibuses as well as one smaller vehicle and the organisation is professionally run with full charitable status with the Charity Commission.
