From the Manse

During the early days of trains, a flagman would take his place in the middle of the street - stopping all traffic as a train approached. During the day he would hold up a STOP sign. At night he would wave a lantern. There is an old story about a flagman and his lantern that goes like this.

There was an accident one dark night at a railroad crossing. A lawsuit followed, and during the proceedings the flagman was called to take the witness stand. The prosecuting attorney asked the usual questions. Then followed an important one. He asked, "On the night of the accident, when you saw the car approaching, did you wave the lantern?" The flagman answered, "Yes, I waved the lantern." The attorney for the prosecution continued with other questions, but before long he came to the same one, "Did you wave that lantern?" "Yes," answered the flagman, "I did wave the lantern." The case seemed to hinge on this bit of testimony. The prosecutor realized it, and so once more he thundered, "I ask you again, when you saw the car approaching the crossing, did you wave the lantern?" Once again, the flagman answered, "I did. Yes, I waved the lantern." The railroad company won the case. No damages were allowed. Later, the defense attorney was talking to the flagman. He said, "The prosecuting attorney really had me worried when he kept asking, 'Did you wave the lantern? Did you wave the lantern?' "Well", said the flagman, "What worried me was that he might ask, 'Was the lantern lit?'"

There is so much waving of dead lanterns. What about ours? The purpose of lanterns and lamps is to give light - to shine, not to wave. We work hard for the kingdom of God in various ways but if we are not shining the light, it would not be as effective as we expect it to be.

Rather, we are more like reflectors which do not have light in themselves. We are to reflect the light of God's Son, Jesus. Yet, Jesus calls us "lights." "You are the light of the world". Matt. 5:14, He says. And as such we are to shine. An unlit lantern is not serving its purpose.

I'm not saying that we are not shining as the light of our community, but I'm thinking of how we can reflect **the light** more effectively in the new year 2020!!!. I think there is only one way to find it: come closer and listen to Him whom we have to reflect.

And as we are approaching lent and Easter, I'd like to suggest that we have an Easter prayer chain from Monday through to the Good Friday service asking every church member and adherent to sign up and pray for 30 min slots including throughout the night.

The chart of the prayer chain will be displayed a few weeks before Holy week to ask sign in. Please pray for it and take an opportunity to pray together for our church, for our community.

We give thanks for all who carry out your wotk in the challenging economic and political situation in Zimbabwe and for the aid organizations that continue to support poor communities. This is the month for the World Wide Day of Prayer, sometimes known as the Women's Day of Prayer. A group of people changed the name as they felt it wasn't just women who pray and the contributions of others should be recognised. However the message did not get through to the diary makers and many have the Women's Day of Prayer listed to take place in March.

How often this happens in life. Messages get confused, distorted, misinterpreted or forgotten, sometimes deliberately, other times accidently. Sometimes we do not have the ability, time or resources to get our message across. Sometimes people just don't listen or aren't there to pick it up and others don't feel it is important.

With all the different resources at our disposal often important messages get overlooked, particularly if people are busy or have too many demands on them.

Colossians 4:2 says, "Be persistent in prayer, and keep alert as you pray giving thanks to God."

Frustrated in waiting, Psalms 6:3 says, "How long O Lord will you wait to help me?"

Sometimes it takes time to get resources together, particularly when there is trouble or confusion. Often it is people from other cultural backgrounds who assist us at these times, like Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well.

This is why John 3:16 says, "God loved the world so much that he gave his only son so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

LLHS aims to provide a safe shelter to people needing emergency night time accommodation. That's where the journey begins towards building a new future.

We also offer help and support for the problems surrounding individuals' homelessness, so they can secure a permanent home.

Leighton Linslade Homeless Service was established in 2006 by a group of volunteers as a pilot exercise based out of 2 portacabins in the grounds of Hockliffe Baptist Church which helped them identify that there was a need in the local area. Volunteers from the community and local churches worked together to ensure the provision of emergency shelter for those who were facing the devastating experience of homelessness and soon it was running all year round between the hours of 10pm and 8am.

It was at the end of 2016 that we moved to our new home in a little village near Malvern Wells called Upper Welland. Our home is within walking distance of the magnificent hills, but far enough from them that we still see the sun in the afternoon!

We arrived in some trepidation not knowing anyone in the Malvern area, but we knew that the Lord was calling us here and particularly to St Andrew's which is a large and thriving church. We have the privilege of leading a Life Group - things don't change! We have been blessed with good fellowship and growing friendships.

It took us a while to find work, but we have both now settled to what feels like the "right" roles. Ali has been setting up the Art Therapy department at St Richard's Hospice, which is in the process of expanding. Chris has set up a Debt Centre in Malvern for Christians Against Poverty. These roles are challenging, in a good way, and feel worthwhile.

Owen married Rachelle in 2018 and we now have a grand daughter Isabelle born in December 2019. Barny continues to live in Leighton Buzzard.

We have fond memories of our time in Leighton Buzzard and send our greetings to all who remember us

Church Council Summary

- 22 Church members present with 7 apologies
- Membership of the meeting list was agreed as correct
- Pastoral concerns & Courtesies: Since the last meeting Phyllis Tucker & Henry Franks have died. Asked to remember them in prayers as well as those recently bereaved and in hospital
- Minutes of both previous meetings (10th October and 10th November) agreed and signed.
- AOB: comment of no young people in the congregation at Trinity; general response that Early Church is well attended by families but a need to publicise more widely. Perhaps a trial of joint 10am services.
- Appointments: Anne Gray nominated Jo Baker and Fay Graves as Church Representatives and further to this, Jo Baker, Fay Graves and Sheila Pollard as representatives from Church Council to Leadership Team. Sheila Pollard has also been nominated as reserve Trinity Representative to Circuit Meeting.
- Vacancies: on-going discussion to find a Trinity representative to Scouts.

Life & Mission of the Church

- Worship Consultation: Parade Sundays have been agreed as best way to allow all uniformed groups to attend an appropriate service. Rev. Dr. Jonathan Hustler will be leading 10.30am service on July 19th (Church Anniversary)
- Messy Church: Very successful Christmas Eve service with approx. 110 attendees. More volunteers needed.
- Leadership Team: Retiring collections list circulated. BRF/Messy
 Church will receive the money in August, Buzzer Buses will be put in
 the January slot from January 2021. Evening services to continue.
 Sheila Pollard explained the need for future funding to continue our
 work on links with the community (more details to follow).
 Catherine Roots reviewed new AV system is working well, though
 Early Church set up takes time. Work completed on time and in
 budget with Circuit and District grants approved.

- Pastoral Oversight: Fellowship meeting for pastoral links to be held Saturday 16th May. Pastoral Leaders Commissioning Service has been changed to Sunday 17th May at 10.30am.
- **Property Committee:** Church roof due to try to locate & repair leak in sanctuary. Double glazing work on rooms 3,4&5, Vestry and Atterbury Room due to be carried out 19th-21st February.
- Finance/Resources/Reserves Policy: Meeting approved Reserves Policy, accounts and Treasurer's report accepted. It is estimated we need a total income of £1330/week to keep in line with June 2019's budget.
- Approval of Annual Report: With a minor modification the draft report was approved and will be circulated in due course.
- Safeguarding: A half-day Advanced Safeguarding Course is being held at Hemel Hempstead on 6th March. See Ann Guy for details.
- Health & Safety: supplies in first aid boxes are up to date; repositioning of the organ is being dealt with; risk assessment for Early Church is in hand.
- Public Issues & Social Action: Article for Trumpeter has been published, Oxjam concert was a success, with possible initiatives for future harvest events in hand.
- Churches Together: Discussion over World Wide Day of Prayer, as reported in June 2019 Church Council a new venue is required for 2020. VE Day celebration Service is on 10th May.
- Circuit Matters: Jackie Roberts drew attention to 'Inspirational Day: Inspire though Storytelling—What's your story?' on 7th March and a Youthscape project starting in May. Desperate need for more Circuit Stewards. A probationary minister has been appointed from September 2020 who will take responsibility for Beech Hill, relieving Rev. Seung-Wook Jung of his extra duties.
