Services at Trinity

It was agreed at Church Council recently that we continue with our current pattern of 10.30am face to face and zoom services until September. While all restrictions around social distancing were lifted on 19 July, to keep everyone safe we ask that you continue to sanitise your hands, keep your distance and wear a mask while moving about in the building. We will also keep the one way system. You will be pleased to hear we are now allowed to sing during services, but we ask that you keep your mask on. While we are no longer required to keep a record of those who visit the building, guidance suggests that we continue to display the Test and Trace QR poster so that people can register themselves via the NHS COVID-19 app. The track and trace sign in sheet will stay at the back door if you need to visit the church premises for any other reason, so do please continue to sign in. We will continue to make a record of others who attend services but you do not have to contact Chris in advance. The Leadership Team will review these decisions before restarting weekly services in September or earlier if necessary.
