Churches Together in Luton

An event for Christians in Luton marking the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Reflecting on the Church post Covid. Saturday 22nd January 2022, 10am-12.30pm at Holy Ghost Catholic Parish Centre, Westbourne Road, Luton, LU4 8JD. Keynote speaker is Rt Rev David J Oakly, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Northampton.

Public Issues (from Charles Horsefield & Cilla Wagner)

It's tempting at this time of year to try to catch the seasonal mood and Cilla has slanted her tips towards an eco-friendly approach to Christmas this week – see below. But before we get to them, let's acknowledge a topic it is hard to avoid at the moment, asylum seekers in small boats. By definition, asylum seekers have escaped risks to their lives at home. Now they find themselves facing greater risks in the hands of criminals who promise to get here. I learned only recently that 81% of asylum seekers don't travel further than the country adjacent to their own, so what might appear to us to be a large number is actually only the relatively small proportion that are able and willing to pay a huge sum of money to come to the UK.

In the latest Joint Public Issues Team Newsletter we are told that

Germany and France both allow asylum seekers to seek employment within a few months of their arrival, whilst their claims are being processed. In the UK such employment is prohibited and we give the people who make it here a very small allowance on which to subsist – much less than they would get in France and Germany. The UK's tough approach is clearly not enough to discourage people who are in fear for their lives. So JPIT are encouraging us to lobby our MP for a change to the no-employment rule that would help to alleviate poverty and whilst helping to address the current chronic shortages of manpower in some industries.

Amongst the people to whom CBC Family Services will be taking Christmas food bags over the next three weeks will be asylum seekers. And many of those food bags will be provided by L.L. Community Foodbank at the Black Horse. There are lots of appeals being made at this time but if anyone wants to buy seasonal fare for the Foodbank, please either put it in the plastic bin in the anteroom or hand it to me direct. We are particularly short of boxes of mince pies at the moment.

Cilla reminds us to try to ensure that all our gifts are sustainably sourced with logos such as Fairtrade, Rainforest Alliance, Energy Star and Palm Oil Tree (a new one on me!). Or better still, that we make presents ourselves. The edible kind will always be enjoyed. Re-use old wrapping-paper where possible, so we don't contribute to the equivalent of 108 million rolls that are thrown away. We can even get creative with brown or plain paper but we should avoid glossy or glittery paper that is not easily recycled. She also suggests we swop our traditional fairy lights for the LED variety that don't get hot but are brighter, even though they last up to 25 times as long and use about 75% less electricity.
