I like reading Psalms and have quite a few favourite Psalms. Psalm 23 is one of them.

As we know it is one of the most popular and most loved psalms, but I have a few personal stories with this Psalm.

It was one of the questions in the English test with a large portion of points in the exam I took when I applied to my Master's course which thankfully made me relieved from the pressure of English. And it was the passage that was engraved on the wood panel which I received as a wedding gift from the church where I used to serve in South Korea.

Anyway, the most interesting part of this Psalm to me is verse 4 'Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me: your rod and your staff, they comfort me'

It reminds me of where I have to look when I am in a difficult situation and what I should expect through the situation and what He did when I get through the darkest valley in my life. The passage from Isaiah 45:3 which I meditated on during my morning meditation a few weeks ago also gives me a clear view of God's intention 'Treasures of darkness, riches stored in secret places'. Great riches are deposited in dark and difficult places. It can be seen as a fearful place but 'Once we fear the Lord, we need fear nothing else'.

We mostly have a negative feeling about 'Fear' but in this case 'fear of God' does not mean actual fear which is threatening us but it's closer to respect or awe and recognising his power and authority

The ACORN method,

So often in our efforts as church we fail to actively involve God, where as ACORN does. This involves a small group meeting initially for 3 weeks for an hour each time.

The first week the ACORN method is explained and explored:
A is for Ask. We start by asking God who he would have us connect with outside of the church.

C is for Call. We listen for Gods call, who is God calling us to speak to.

O is for Obey. We obey God - and contact whoever he has called us to contact and start a conversation by simply asking "How are you?"

R is for Report - what we might call testimony. We talk about what happened as a result of asking God who to contact. This happens back in the group the 2nd week. As one individual speaks the rest listen and:

N is for Notice. The rest of the group whilst listening notice where God was as often others notice when we ourselves cannot see.

Then there are also 2 ACORN method groups planned each for 3 weeks.

Luke Bretherton – "Christ, Democracy, and the Struggle for a Common Life"

During the session Luke will use key Christian ideas, including love, lament and listening, to unpack how through doing politics in a democratic way we can help sustain a generous and just common life in days when societies can be divided and polarised. These are important matters in the world today. Please come along and engage with them and with Luke, in this session.

Luke Bretherton is Robert E. Cushman Distinguished Professor of Moral and Political Theology and Senior Fellow of the Kenan Institute for Ethics at Duke University, USA. Before joining Duke in 2012, he taught at King's College London. His latest book is *Christ and the Common Life: Political Theology and the Case for Democracy* (2019). His other books include *Resurrecting Democracy* (2015), which was based on a study of community organizing; *Christianity & Contemporary Politics* (2010); and *Hospitality as Holiness* (2006), about pluralism. He is actively involved in grassroots democratic politics.

Back Stronger—Pentecost Praise 2022

Stopsley Baptist Church are holding a Pentecost Praise service on Sunday 5th June at 7pm. Rob Parsons, founder of Care for the Family is the Guest Speaker. All are welcome to attend.

Public Issues (from Charles Horsefield & 'Cilla Wagner)

The latest good news from Hope and Aid Direct is that more convoys for the Ukraine have arrived safely since Cilla last reported. Currently the local Military Veterans charity are collecting children's clothes and toys and anyone wishing to donate such items can do so via Cilla and Phil. It has been good to see dried goods appearing once again in the Foodbank bin in the anteroom – but it is now empty again.

Appeal for Bibles and religious literature – Cilla reports that there was a good response including unwanted Bibles in a number of translations; books on prayer and Bible study; and anthologies of religious poetry and prose. All are going to the Book Aid Charitable Trust who will transport them to poorer countries where they are in short supply. The donated books include Good News, NIV, English, Living and Amplified Bibles as well as introductions to the Old and New Testaments; Concordances; Wild Goose Resources publications and Methodist Handbooks. Also prayer books written by saints and theologians over the centuries (including Charles and John Wesley) illustrated books by Eddie Askew and Hilary Faith Jones, Lions Book of the Bible and many more. 1. Prayers were offered for continuing fellowship in our society, appreciation of our past and inspiration for our future, working with wisdom, courage and perseverance.

7. Church Life:

- A) Brief reports from some church groups had been circulated through Trinity News for the whole church to review. These groups included Messy Church, Baptism Secretary’s report, Public Issues & Social Action, Pastoral Group, Churches Together, Badminton Club, Safeguarding, Knit & Natter. A question was asked about the future of The Girls’ Brigade, but this is still under consideration.
- B) Leadership Team: the report had been circulated before the meeting. The positive outcome of the year has been the resuming of all our services as face-to-face gatherings. More people are needed to fill the leadership and support roles involved. Thanks are due to all those who have kept the church services and facilities going over the pandemic.
- C) Minister’s Report: Seung-Wook noted that he is now

completing his fifth year at Trinity, and has been appointed to serve for another five years. He wanted to thank everyone, especially those serving on the various committees for their support. It is encouraging that we have been able to bring back all our regular services since March and have been able to serve refreshments as well, which enhance our community spirit. We must now, however, remember Jesus' message to 'love your neighbour' and re-build our mission work. We have over 100 members, working teams and a lovely building. We must stand together as pioneers, creating new beginnings, step-by-step, at God's pace, in his way. Let's find it and do it together.

Comments: the form of communion service conducted this morning, with a blessing at the communion rail before dismissal of each group , was much appreciated; it is also welcome when we have live music at Early Church and the 10:30 service.

D) Finance: the report had been circulated before the meeting. Sheila thanked David Dawes for his work on the accounts during the two difficult years of the pandemic. This financial year is proving just as trying, with reduced income and ever-rising energy costs. The deficit in the General Fund is likely to be around £10,000 to £12,000, rather than the figure previously estimated. There were no questions raised concerning the Annual Report. The congregation thanked Sheila for her tireless work.

E) Property: the report had been circulated before the meeting. Maintenance of the building has been the biggest drain on our finances. Re-roofing part of the building had been unavoidable. No date has yet been arranged for the 2022 quinquennial survey, but it is imminent. As noted in the report, the priority is to carry out work required from the 2017 Quinquennial Review

before the next one, due in 2022. Thanks expressed to Property Committee.

8. AOB:

- A) Catherine Roots: wanted to clarify that the proposed Games Afternoon was not prevented from happening or closed down. Any offers to run it would be welcome. On grounds of safety there must be 2 people responsible, and the usual safeguarding procedures must be completed satisfactorily. There is money available to buy new equipment. Kathy Keeley offered to help.
- B) Noreen Henshaw: reported that Trinity Fellowship Circle had been formed in 2010, developing from the Regnal Circle of the 1960s. It had run a diverse programme of social events and worked to raise funds for its chosen charities. It ceased to meet during the pandemic, and as its membership has declined and no-one is able to take on leadership roles, it has reluctantly been decided to disband. Thanks were expressed to Noreen and the other officers for their work.
- C) Joan Gregory: volunteered to co-ordinate an afternoon tea to be held on Thursday, 2nd June at 3pm to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.
- D) Jean Staples: remarked that it had been difficult for those without computers to access the various services and meetings held during the pandemic. It was pointed out that many meetings held on Zoom had also been accessible through the telephone. Churches Together had not held its usual Lent Course. It is intended to start more face-to-face housegroups in the future.
