LIFT HIGH THE CROSS

Every year we 'Lift High the Cross', that being our Palm Crosses as we sing together this wonderful hymn on Palm Sunday. But what do you know about your palm cross and where it comes from?

The African Palms project was started in 1965 by Fr. Alan Talbot an Anglican Priest who served for 6 years as a missionary in the Diocese of Masasi, Tanzania.



The main aim of the project was to give local villagers a meagre income, whilst retaining dignity and the ability to carry on their farming work.

Over the years the number of Palm Crosses sold increased and in 1986 the company 'African Palms Limited' was formed. All profits made by the company are covenanted to a trust for use in Educational and Healthcare projects.

The Palm Crosses are made from dried branches of the dwarf palm Hyphae Coriacia. These grow wild in the Masasi area, so are not cultivated or chemically treated, furthermore no trees are cut down in the work of collecting the Palm leaves for plaiting the Palm Crosses. All the crosses are hand woven.

So on Palm Sunday when you 'Lift High your Cross' spare a moment of prayer for the person who will have woven your cross.

The Trinity Community Action Group hosted an interesting meeting on 31st March with our MP Alex Mayer, Florence Wright from JPIT (the Churches' Joint Public Interest Team https://jpit.uk/) and representatives of Leighton Linslade Helpers. Discussion centred on the (relative) poverty to be found in parts of the town and how Trinity, as a church, might support Alex in addressing this issue. When



Alex left us she went on to visit The Helpers at their Foodbank off Billington Road.

Florence coordinates the Constituency Action Network Initiative in JPIT and she is hoping that Trinity will sign up to join this at our Annual Church Meeting in May. She told us that there are about 100 churches involved. She is a very keen campaigner, as can be seen from the March issue of JPIT News, which she compiled. Listed there are several opportunities to join webinars and to write to the government, some of these relate to recent announcements about cuts in benefits and funding for farmers as well as for overseas aid. Circuit News

Circuit Listening Day, Saturday 26th April 2025, 10.30am

You are invited to an important Listening Day on Saturday, 26th April 2025, at Newland Church, Crawley Green Road, Luton, LU2 9TE (formerly known as Wigmore).

This day is a key opportunity for us to gather, reflect, and share our thoughts, concerns, and hopes as we seek God's vision for the future of our Circuit. Your presence and voice are crucial in shaping the path ahead. This Listening Day is part of a broader, ongoing process of reflection and discernment that we are undertaking as a Circuit.

As we reflect together as staff, we rejoice in the good things we notice across the Circuit:

- The warmth, faithfulness and generosity of our people, and the welcome given to preachers by congregations,
- The care and support shared between people and more widely with the community.

However we also notice some challenges and are sure you will be aware of these:

- The difficulties in staffing the Circuit both financially internally and due to the shortage of ministers connexionally.
- We are losing one ¾ minister this summer and may then lose further members of staff in subsequent years – and these may not be replaced.
- Churches are struggling to find personnel willing to take up some of the posts.
- Ministers are feeling the pressure of being spread more thinly and not able to build relationships as they would wish, particularly if pastoral responsibilities keep changing The need to have discerned a way forward by May when further conversations will be occurring about stationing of ministers.

Our current Circuit Mission Statement commits us to working according to some guiding principles:

- deep listening to churches by walking alongside them in envisioning their future story
- the future of the churches and circuit is a result of consultation, not a CLT matter only
- the process of coming to decisions about how human and financial resources are used will involve the churches
- each church's discernment will be respected and the wisdom of the people within that church valued
- all we do is underpinned by the good news of the gospel and our theology of hope and surrounded by prayer

This process is about more than structural or staffing decisions and simply reallocating churches and ministers and spreading support more thinly. It is about discerning what is essential and what God wants us to prioritise in this season. We are committed to listening to God, to each other and to the Circuit as a whole. Your involvement is vital in shaping the proposals that will guide our future together.

We look forward to gathering with you for this crucial time of prayer, reflection and discernment as together we seek God's guidance for the future of the Circuit.

The Day will start at 10.30am and finish at 3.30pm. Lunch will be provided by the Circuit and churches are invited to bring cakes to share.

Please indicate on the signup sheet on the notice board in the church corridor if you hope to attend, if you need a lift or will have a spare seat in your car. Alternatively contact a steward to add your name to the list.
