Talking about Trinity 2 - progress report

Thirty-six people attended our Talking about Trinity 2 workshop on 29 June 2024 which was facilitated by Angela Brydon, District Discipleship Enabler. The event used the Methodist Way of Life as a basis to generate discussion which will support our thinking about future mission and outreach plans for Trinity. It was followed up by discussion at Church Council on 18 July 2024.

The discussion highlighted the work currently or recently ongoing at Trinity, areas which we could take forward with input from the congregation and existing groups, as well as ideas which need more thought and strategic planning to develop an updated mission plan for Trinity.

Over the past year many of the ideas have been put into action.

Trinity's place in LB - changing how people see us

- The Community Action Group is working to develop links with local groups and our MP
- Support for local charities LB Mencap and Marie Curie as our Charities of the Year
- Posters in the front window publicising services and activities
- Website update and our Easter and Christmas services publicised in Bee Local
- Reinstated Welcome cards for visitors to our services

Worship and corporate faith

- Preaching series at the 10.30 services during Advent and Lent
- Prompt cards on the coffee tables after some services to encourage members to talk more about their faith
- Feedback/comments cards

Personal faith and learning / prayer

- Fortnightly zoom bible studies and an Advent bible study series was held at the church
- The prayer board in the Anteroom has been reinstated for your prayer requests

Being part of Trinity/ Working for Trinity

- Calls in Trinity News for volunteers for specific roles in the church have resulted in new volunteers
- The notice boards in the church corridor and Hall have been reorganised to better present the activities at Trinity, in particular the Community Action Group (CAG)

The needs of the world (EcoChurch/justice)

- We have achieved our EcoChurch Silver status and renewed our FairTrade status
- CAG have been part of the Lets End Poverty campaign to lobby our MP and local government

Importantly the workshop highlighted areas of work which need to be considered over the longer term. Alison Arnold has led the Trinity Development Group in thinking about how we can develop our work with families and young people. The group is currently putting together papers to support employment of a Messy Church organiser/Toddler leader – two areas highlighted at the workshop.

So there has been real change following the workshop but there is more we can do. Submit your suggestions on the green Comments cards in the Anteroom. We await developments from the Trinity Development Group on how we move forward with our work with families and young people.
